Work Out What You Can Afford

Decide what you can afford before you start house hunting. Remember you will have to budget for gas, electricity, water, internet and a TV licence, as well as food and general household items. However, bear in mind that should you decide to live with non-students you will be required to pay council tax.

Contact your Agent

Where students want to take a property as a group, there will often be a Lead Tenant. This person will serve as a point of contact for the Landlord or Managing Agent. This Lead Tenant may also be responsible for the return of individual deposits to the other tenants when the money is returned by the Landlord.

Work Out your Priorities

Traditionally, students have placed a premium on being as close as possible to their university or college in order to minimise their commute. However given recent events, and the increasingly online nature of many courses, students may now prefer a balanced approach to choosing where to live. Your agent will be able to tell you about the shopping, restaurants and other amenities available around a given property.
